Chalfont Heights Roads Committee History of annual subscription rates

Roads Committee was founded in 1956 as a means of funding road repairs which were no longer being undertaken by the Stroud family.

1957 The first annual subscription was set at £5 per house

1958 First AGM 20 June 1958 subscriptions increased to 6 guineas

1962 AGM 9 July 1962 it was proposed and agreed that the full rate subscription would remain at 6 guineas, with half rate for residents of Lewis Lane and Sandy Rise who made up the road at their own expense.

1970 AGM 6 July 1970 subscription increased to £10, with £6 reduced rate

1973 AGM 28 September 1973 agreed that reduced rate subscriptions would be phased out and held at a £4 differential only for those householders who made the original £30 payments.

1974 subscription raised to £16, with £12 reduced rate

1975 AGM 14 March 1975 the Treasurer was given unanimous approval to negotiate and adjust the annual subscription where genuine cases of hardship were known to exist, the discretion to be used sparingly. There were only one or two known cases.

- 1978 Subscription raised to £20, with £16 reduced rate
- 1981 Subscription raised to £24, with £20 reduced rate
- 1982 Subscription raised to £30, with £26 reduced rate
- 1984 Subscription raised to £35, with £31 reduced rate
- 1986 Subscription raised to £45, with £41 reduced rate
- 1998 Subscription raised to £60, with £56 reduced rate
- 2001 Reduced rate finally phased out, subscription £75 for all residents
- 2003 Subscription raised to £120
- 2006 Subscription raised to £150
- 2010 Subscription raised to £170, reduced to £160 with Bankers Order
- 2014 Subscription raised to £300, various options available for payment
